

## Year 9 News

On Monday Year 9 took part in a STEM event delivered by the Royal Air Force in collaboration with Manchester United. STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. The outcomes relied on communication skills, teamwork, strategic planning and hard work.



## Modern Foreign Languages

It has been a very scary start to half term 2 for the MFL faculty as this week we celebrated “El día de los muertos” (The Day of The Dead) This is a Mexican tradition, similar to halloween, in which people celebrate the lives and memories of their deceased loved ones. In class, pupils learnt about the different traditions and activities that take place each year which range from street parties, creating “ofrendas (altars) at the graves and eating “Pan de Muertos” (Bread of the Dead). On top of this, pupils designed their own “calavera” skull.

As well as our scary lessons, we have also continued with our extra-curricular clubs for MFL. Tuesday lunchtimes see the return of the ever-popular “Linguascope Club” which is open to all year groups. 

## English

Form Time Reading: A shared pleasure with a serious aim.

This Thursday morning, we launched our Form-Time Reading initiative. Each form across the school has been given a novel, play or anthology of short stories to read together. The aim is to encourage pupils and staff to share and discuss engaging stories. The stories have been specifically chosen because they tackle and discuss issues pertinent to young people across all cultures and backgrounds today. Pupils and staff alike, thoroughly enjoyed an extended form time during which they were able to get stuck into their stories, spend time discussing crucial issues and at the same time further develop their reading skills.

The books chosen cover many topics from the dangers of gang culture for teenagers and the struggle for families living through civil war, to the effects of discrimination across many contexts. I was lucky enough to have the privilege of visiting most forms during the morning and seeing our pupils becoming their characters (accents and all) whilst reading and their visualisation of characters' situations. Pupils left the session discussing their texts on the way out, as well as asking pupils from different forms what they were reading during the morning.

A particular highlight for me, was Miss Ellis describing how her form had been watching videos explaining the current crisis in Syria to help them empathise with the leading character in their story, *Dangerous Crossing*, and how some of our pupils from Syria were correcting her pronunciation whilst reading: the whole class learning together through literature!



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

## Humanities


## Art and Design

Art Club: we have complete all of our sets ready for animation. We will be putting final touches to our work characters this week.




Set Design: our set pieces are looking suitably atmospheric and we are starting work on gather costumes this week.
