
# Whole School Updates

#### **Mathematics: Greek mathematics!**

Pupils have been treated to maths lessons focusing on the Greek influence on mathematics in order celebrate European day of languages! It has been a great opportunity for pupils to develop an understanding of the origin of much of the maths that we study today! Have a look at the diagram to get yourself thinking! Enrichment clubs are in full flow, and attendance to these is growing nicely. A special mention to our stars of the week! #### **English: Creative story tellers...**

This week in English Year 7 have been writing their own fables. This term we are exploring and questioning what the purpose of telling stories is. Year 7 have been carefully crafting their own stories in order to convey some very important messages that might help you make the right decisions in life. #### Science: Bunsen burners and enzymes!

This week in Science Year 7 have been using Bunsen burners in the laboratories. Pupils took part in flame tests; flame test are an analytic procedure used in chemistry to detect the presence of certain elements, primarily metal ions, by burning them with a Bunsen burner. Year 10 have been focusing on key concepts in biology. Pupils conducted an experiment to answer: How does pH affect the breakdown of starch by the enzyme amylase?



#### Humanities: Who will be crowned the king?

Year 7 have started the new academic year brilliantly; they have been studying the three contenders vying for the throne and the honour of being King of Medieval England. We have seen plenty of enthusiasm and great passion for History. This was particularly the case when deciding 'who should be king'. Year 7 held an election in the classes, with group presentations and posters arguing which contender was best suited to be king. We have had varying results across the year group – but a favourite did emerge; William Duke of Normandy. However, Year 7 will have to wait to next week to find out who did become King.

Last week in physical education we had a fantastic turn out at cricket club! It was a brilliant display of batting and bowling in the nets across all the year groups. This week in design & technology, Year 10 have worked hard starting their table tennis bat project, they have been focusing particularly on accurate measuring and material tolerances.




#### Hospitality and Catering: **\* \* \* \***
