British

28th April 1888

Folkestone, England

Walter was an orphan who grew up in a orphanage in London, he's mum died of cancer when he was only 3. He became the first black player to play for Tottenham Hotspurs at the age of 21. He also became the first footballer to enlist to the British Army during World War 1 in 1914. Tull was commissioned as a second lieutenant on 30 May 1917, he became the first mixed-heritage infantry officer in a regular British Army regiment. He showed great resilience and dedication to his country. I particular like how he gave up his football career to fight for his country.



Physical Education


