


Year 7 – Mr Diaz






Manchester Safeguarding Partnership Conference at the Museum of Science and Industry

On Monday, 6 pupils spoke at the Manchester Safeguarding Partnership Conference at the Museum of Science and Industry. The event is organised by the Rights Respecting Schools Award and Manchester City Council, and brings together a select number of schools to speak out on safeguarding issues that are relevant to them. It is attended by multiple agencies such as the NHS, the Assistant Police Commissioner, UNICEF, Transport of Greater Manchester and other health and wellbeing charities.

Zayd, Year 8, Israa, Shannea, Tasnim, Noor, Year 10, and Ibrahim, Year 11, had worked together for three months to prepare their presentation on Child on Child abuse. They were the first group to present and set the standard high, mixing serious information with a number of interactive tasks and audience participation. They have since been partnered with the Designated Doctor for Safeguarding Children in Manchester to work on a campaign to reduce child on child abuse happening in the community. They have also been asked to speak at the UNICEF Making Manchester a Child Friendly City event next month, and the educational outreach officer from GMP also wants to use our school for youth voice projects. The pupils performed brilliantly and were by far the most engaged and vocal school there. They truly showed the spirit of being Proud to Belong.
